

CLEAN GAMES POLICY

Beijing 2022

What is the Clean Games Policy (CGP)?

- The CGP sets out the clean sport education requirements for athletes and support personnel when long listed, selected and competing at a Major Games.
- The policy identifies the required level of education for those athletes and support personnel dependent on their experience.
- Together our aim is to protect clean athletes and support personnel by minimising the risk of doping and provide the support and knowledge to motivate athletes to remain clean and demonstrate clean sport behaviours and values

This information sheet provides a summary of the clean sport education requirements for the Beijing 2022 Winter Olympic and Paralympic Games.

Athlete Education Requirements

All **long listed** athletes require the following education:

- First time 'Games' athletes must complete a **Clean Sport 1 workshop**
- Second time 'Games' athletes must complete a **Clean Sport 2 workshop** (on the basis that they have completed Clean Sport 1 or an approved equivalent session, in the passed 2 years, in preparation for their first Games and can evidence that)
- Multiple (3 or more consecutive) 'Games' athletes must complete a **Clean Sport Refresher or Clean Sport 1 workshop** (on the basis that they have completed Clean Sport 1 and 2 or an approved equivalent session, in the passed two to four years, in preparation for their past Games and can evidence that)

Once selected, all athletes must complete a UKAD **Clean Games** Education workshop. This workshop provides key anti-doping information relevant to Beijing 2022.



Athlete Support Personnel (ASP)

All long listed ASP must complete the following education:

- The **UKAD Clean Sport Advisor or Introduction to Clean Sport** eLearning found on the Clean Sport Hub. The course expiry date must cover the period of the games. *Please be aware the Clean Sport Advisor is currently only valid until 31/3/2022.*

UKAD will provide some optional scenarios based education workshops for ASP to further their knowledge.

Once selected, all ASP must complete a UKAD **Clean Games** Education workshop. This workshop provides key anti-doping information relevant to Beijing 2022.

Coaches

All long listed Coaches must complete the following education:

- The **UKAD Coach Clean** eLearning found on the Clean Sport Hub. The course expiry date must cover the period of the games. *Please be aware personal coaches will be expected to complete these education requirements as well.*

UKAD will provide some optional scenarios based education workshops for Coaches to further their knowledge.

Once selected, all Coaches must complete a UKAD **Clean Games** Education workshop. This workshop provides key anti-doping information relevant to Beijing 2022.



Additional Requirements and information

- At least one parent, carer or guardian of an athlete under 18 must receive a digital copy of the UKAD **Clean Sport Essentials: Parents and Carers guide**
- In addition, parents, carers and guardians will also be able to access an optional scenarios-based education workshop provided by UKAD.
- Education workshops can be delivered virtually or in person. There must be a register of attendance for both.
- Any National Governing Bodies delivery education themselves through their UKAD Accredited Educator can the relevant UKAD resources. If using their own resources these must be signed off through the UKAD Major Games Equivalency Check process.
